Пояснительная записка к промежуточной аттестации по английскому языку в 8 классе за 2020 - 2021 учебный год

Промежуточная аттестация по английскому языку в 8 классе проводится в форме тестирования.

Цель проведения работы: определение уровня усвоения учащимися основных знаний и умений за курс 8 класса.

Содержание и структура работы для промежуточной аттестации по английскому языку разработаны на основе следующего **УМК**: Ю. Ваулина Дж. Дули, О. Подоляко, В. Эванс «Английский в фокусе – 8» – M.: Просвещение, 2018

Условия и порядок выполнения работы (время):

45 минут (раздел «Лексика и грамматика» - 30 минут; радел «Чтение» 15 минут).

Структура и содержание работы

Работа состоит из двух разделов:

Раздел I «Лексика и Грамматика» содержит 6 заданий (32 балла):

- 1) Задание на выбор и запись правильного ответа из предложенного перечня слов при заполнении пропусков в предложениях по пройденным темам (8 баллов)
- 2) Задание на выбор правильной видовременной формы англ. глагола в активном залоге (10 баллов)
- 3) Задание на использование нужной видовременной формы англ. глагола при переводе активного залога в пассивный (2 балла)
- 4) Задание на словообразование (6 баллов)
- 5) Задание на употребление предлогов (Збалла)
- 6) Задание на употребление фразовых глаголов (3 балла)

Раздел II «Чтение» содержит одно задание (7) на понимание в прочитанном тексте запрашиваемой информации (5 баллов).
